# TROPARION, KONTAKION & PROKEIMENON

#### **Troparion – Tone 7**

By Thy <u>Cross</u> Thou didst destroy <u>death</u>. To the thief Thou didst open <u>Par</u>adise. For the <u>Myrrh</u>bearers Thou didst change weeping into <u>joy</u>, and Thou didst command Thy disciples, O <u>Christ</u> God, to pro<u>claim</u> that Thou art <u>risen</u>,// granting the <u>world</u> great <u>mercy</u>.

# **Troparion - Tone 4**

Armed with youthful <u>fer</u>vor, thou didst endure martyrdom in old age and didst <u>glo</u>rify Christ. Thou didst offer Him thy right hand as a whole burnt <u>of</u>fering and thy holy soul as a blameless <u>sac</u>rifice.// Intercede that all that be granted forgiveness, Great-martyr <u>Bar</u>laam.

#### Kontakion - Tone 7

The do<u>min</u>ion of death can no longer hold men <u>cap</u>tive, for Christ descended, shattering and destroying its <u>pow</u>ers. Hell is <u>bound</u>, while the Prophets rejoice and cry: "The Savior has come to <u>those</u> in faith;// enter, you <u>faithful</u>, into the Resurrection!"

#### Kontakion - Tone 3

Though weak with old <u>age</u> thou didst vanquish the <u>E</u>vil One in thy mighty contest, O <u>Bar</u>laam. Thou didst endure the rack like one without a <u>body</u>, and didst steadfastly endure the <u>burn</u>ing of thy hand.// Therefore, God the Word has <u>crowned</u> thee with a <u>crown</u> of <u>glory</u>.

# <u>Prokeimenon – Tone 7</u>

The Lord shall give strength to His people. / The Lord shall bless His people with peace.

V. Offer to the Lord, O you sons of God! Offer young rams to the Lord!

#### LITURGICAL COMMEMORATION

#### **Prophet Obadiah (Abdia)**

The holy Prophet Obadiah [or Abdia] is the fourth of the Twelve Minor Prophets, and he lived during the ninth century B.C. He was from the village of Betharam, near Sichem, and he served as steward of the impious Israelite King Ahab. In those days the whole of Israel had turned away from the true God and had begun to offer sacrifice to Baal, but Obadiah faithfully served the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob in secret.

When Ahab's wife, the impious and dissolute Jezebel, hunted down all the prophets of the Lord (because of her quarrel with the Prophet Elias), Obadiah gave them shelter and food (3/1 Kgs 18:3 ff). Ahab's successor King Okhoziah [Ahaziah] sent three detachments of soldiers to arrest the holy Prophet Elias (July 20). One of these detachments was headed by the holy Prophet Obadiah. Through the prayer of the Prophet Elias, two of the detachments were consumed by heavenly fire, but Obadiah and his detachment were spared by the Lord (4/2 Kgs 1). From that moment Obadiah resigned from military service and became a follower of the Prophet Elias. Afterward, he himself received the gift of prophecy. The Godinspired work of the Prophet Obadiah is the fourth of the Books of the Twelve Minor Prophets in the Bible, and contains

predictions about the future salvation of the Gentiles (Vs. 15) and that the Savior would come forth from Sion (Vs. 17). The holy Prophet Obadiah, whose name means servant (or worshipper) of the Lord, was buried in Samaria. In iconography, the Prophet Obadiah is depicted as a grey-haired old man with a rounded beard. His scroll reads: "In that day, saith the Lord, I shall destroy the wise men out of Idumea." (Obadiah 8).

# Martyr Barlaam of Caesarea, in Cappadocia

The Holy Martyr Barlaam lived in Antioch of Syria. During Diocletian's persecution against Christians, the aged Saint Barlaam was arrested and brought to trial, where he confessed himself a Christian.

The judge, wanting to compel the saint to renounce Christ, ordered that Saint Barlaam be brought to the pagan altar. His right hand was placed over it, and a red-hot censer burning with incense was put into his hand. The torturer thought that a physically weak old man could not endure the pain and would drop it on the altar. In this way he would involuntarily be offering sacrifice to the idol. However, the saint held on to the censer until his hand fell off. After this, the holy Martyr Barlaam surrendered his soul to the Lord.

#### **EPISTLE & GOSPEL READINGS**

# Epistle: Ephesians 2:14-22

For He Himself is our peace, who has made both one, and has broken down the middle wall of separation, having abolished in His flesh the enmity, that is, the law of commandments contained in ordinances, so as to create in Himself one new man from the two, thus making peace, and that He might reconcile them both to God in one body through the cross, thereby putting to death the enmity. And He came and preached peace to you who were afar off and to those who were near. For through Him we both have access by one Spirit to the Father. Now, therefore, you are no longer strangers and foreigners, but fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God, having been built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Jesus Christ Himself being the chief cornerstone, in whom the whole building, being fitted together, grows into a holy temple in the Lord, in whom you also are being built together for a dwelling place of God in the Spirit.

# Gospel: Luke 12:16-21

Then He spoke a parable to them, saying: "The ground of a certain rich man yielded plentifully. And he thought within himself, saying, 'What shall I do, since I have no room to store my crops?' So he said, 'I will do this: I will pull down my barns and build greater, and there I will store all my crops and my goods. 'And I will say to my soul, "Soul, you have many goods laid up for many years; take your ease; eat, drink, and be merry." But God said to him, 'Fool! This night your soul will be required of you; then whose will those things be which you have provided?' So is he who lays up treasure for himself, and is not rich toward God."
